- Out of ten full time teachers six are Ph.D. Holders which is the highest degree in higher education.
- College collects on and average Rs. 4500 as fees per head from the students. Normally strength of the students is 1600 per year , college is not collecting any other fee or charges from the students still we are organizing more than 50 programme every year which includes National moot Court competition, national PPT, state level debate , regional level workshop, NSS and many other activities including sports and guest lectures. This is unique feature of the college which was also appreciated by NAAC peer team in last visit.

- In spite of special coaching for developing communication skills less number of students join this classes.
- Research and publication activities need to be strengthen.
