

## Report of the XIII National Level Moot court Competition 2012-2013

National Level Moot court Competition is considered as one of the most reputed moot court competitions in India and hence attracts participants from all over India . This year total 17 teams had participated from various states such as Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh , Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and the union territory of Delhi.

Since last year the college has started with the innovative practice of calling problems for the moot court competition from the faculty and advocates. 8 problems which were received by the college were sent to the panel of juries consisting of Hon'ble Justice A.B. Naik , Adv. Shri. Umakant Patil, and Adv. Shri. Rajendra Deshmukh . 2 problems were selected which were drafted by Adv. Shri Akshay Radikar, Practising advocate at Bombay High Court and Prof. Aman Mishra Asst. Prof. New Law College, Bharti Vidyapeeth, Pune , for the preliminary and final round . the problem for the preliminary round was focusing on Anti corruption law and the final round problem was rotating around Art. 21 of the Constitution, the infringement of fundamental right by the police agency, the government instrumentality whether it fits within *the procedure established by law* clause.

The preliminary round of the competition was judged by the renowned advocates such as Adv . ..... and the following five teams were selected –
