


In the beginning the Dr. Anisha Shaikh , Assistant professor Bharati Vidyapeeth New Law College, Pune introduced the subtheme to the participants . Dr. Nirmala while dealing with the assigned theme gave orientation about all the four rights i.e. survival and development, participation and protection. Dr Nirmala further focused on vulnerability ground realities and implementation of POCSO Act in AP. She narrated real incidences of forced prostitution, neglect towards these children and working of CRC. Madam also discussed about the poverty illiteracy , unemployment as the cause behind the violations of child rights It was followed by Q&A Session . III Session was on Right to education and child labour for which **Dr. Sheetal Sharma, Associate Professor , JNU, New Delhi was the resource person.** The sub theme of the session was introduced by Ms. Shivkanya Kadam, Assistant Professor Govt. Institute of Forensic Science, Nagpur. During the Session Dr. Sheetal Sharma not only provided the reference of national legislations but also expressed that there is a need to have interdisciplinary approach while studying and understanding Human rights. Dr. Sharma referred to certain theories and evolution process of right to education, and European history of Paradigm shift in the education system. While dealing with the theoretical perspectives Dr Sharma continued discourse on Sustenance and conflict perspectives. important steps towards reaching to the end of education and challenges in Implementation of RTE Act, 2009 were also discussed in depth.
